About Us

Faith Kitchen continues to provide nutritious meals daily, Monday through Saturday. With the help of over 240 volunteers we served 36,409 meals in 2013!

Funding for Faith Kitchen is received from businesses, individuals, service organizations, and churches.

We wish we could say that the poor and food insecure people of Dover will not need us in the near future, but given the recent further cuts in food stamps, this community will need us more than ever.


In 2013 we were blessed by the Food Bank of New Jersey and Acme Supermarkets to be able to offer 400-600 pounds of produce, meat, bread, and eggs for lunch at Faith Kitchen and for clients to take home.

In 1983 Faith Kitchen first opened it's doors one day a week and served 64 meals.

Toady we are honored to serve approximately 97 clients daily for meals.

Meals are prepared by volunteers from many faiths and groups and provisions come from individuals, corporations, and grants.

To help network clients into social service agency, jobs, housing, mental and physical healthcare, etc.



Statement of Purpose

At the September 1983 council meeting, Trinity Lutheran Church approved the establishment of Faith Kitchen, a "Soup Kitchen", for the purpose of reducing the problem of hunger in the Dover area through community and congregational involvement.

In 1983 Faith Kitchen served 64 meals. One year later we were serving 2,404 meals and the need for meals was growing. In 1993, just 10 years after Faith Kitchen first opened it's doors 32,543 meals were served year.

Today, 30 years later, we are proud to serve 42,988 meals a year 6 days a week! We are honored that approximately 91 clients join us daily for meals.

Meals are prepared with volunteers from various faiths and groups.
Provisions and monetary support comes from individuals, corporations, and grants.
